As a guarantee of sporting fairness, the Vendée Globe requires skippers to sail on IMOCA class yachts.


These are the most powerful monohulls in the world, handled by a single sailor.

These 60-foot yachts (18.28 meters) are designed to be as light and robust as possible. They must be able to cope with all sailing conditions and break speed records. Each yacht is adapted to its skipper: the spaces are designed according to the sailor's size for greater comfort and, above all, to make handling easier.

Where does the term IMOCA come from?

The construction of IMOCA yachts has been regulated by the International Monohull Open Class Association (IMOCA) since 1991. This association determines the measurement protocol (prohibitions, limitations and obligations) to be respected when building these boats to guarantee sailors' safety. It provides opportunities for engineers and skippers to experiment and innovate, with the invention of foils, double rudder blades, and so on. In 2021, the IMOCA class was the first ocean racing class to bring in technical rules designed to reduce boats' impact on the environment with a positive approach.

The speed of a boat is measured in knots, not kilometers per hour (kph) as with cars. Depending on the wind and the type of sail chosen by the skipper, the boats in the last Vendée Globe reached peak speeds of up to 35 knots or around 65 kph.


Activity 3

Insert the words

After reading the definitions, insert the key words in the diagram.

- **Mast:** with a maximum height of 29 m, this "pole" is used to hoist the sails.
- **Mainsail:** this is the only sail attached along the entire height of the mast.
- **Spinnaker (spi):** sail located at the front; the wind makes it "billow" to propel the boat.
- **Jib:** foresail.
- **Boom:** this 9 m long pole holds the lower part of the mainsail taut.
- **Bowsprit:** tube placed horizontally at the front of the boat to secure the foresails.
- **Cockpit:** the space where the skipper controls the boat: this is where you find the coffee grinder, the tiller and so on.
- **Tiller:** the "rudder" of the yacht. It is used to change the direction of the rudder blades.
- **Rudder blades:** these two fins are located under the boat. They are connected to the tiller and steer the boat.
- **Canting keel:** the lowest part of the boat. The keel reduces the risk of the boat capsizing.
- **Foils:** moustache-shaped "wings" that raise the hull.
- **Living unit:** sheltered area containing the chart table, on-board computer, bunk and skipper's gear.
